Witness with Courage

"Your endurance will win you your lives." (Luke 21:19)

When we read this passage from Luke's Gospel, we hear Jesus speaking about the destruction of the Temple, wars, earthquakes, famine, and persecution. It's dramatic and unsettling. But to understand its purpose, we must remember that Luke was writing decades after Jesus' death, at a time when many of these predicted events had already occurred. The Temple had been destroyed, early Christians were being persecuted, and the fledgling communities were feeling the pressure of uncertainty and fear.

Luke's intention, then, is not to provide a historical transcript of Jesus' words, but to offer hope and reassurance to his community. The gospel is written not as biography but as proclamation. The evangelist is showing his readers that Jesus understood their suffering, and more than that, that their suffering had meaning. Jesus "predicts" these events not to frighten, but to reassure. The message to the early Church — and to us — is clear: *Hold on. Stay faithful. Do not be afraid. God is still at work in the midst of chaos.*

Jesus does not promise ease or escape. He speaks of betrayal, hardship, and opposition — even from one's own family. But he also promises presence: "I myself will give you words and a wisdom..." (v. 15). The trials his followers face will not be the end of the story, and not even a hair of their head will be lost — not in the ultimate sense. Their endurance will lead them into life.

This message remains relevant today. When we feel overwhelmed by the "earthquakes" and "wars" of our own time — be they personal, communal, or global — Luke reminds us that we are part of a bigger story. Faithfulness does not mean being spared from difficulty; it means trusting that God is with us through it. The gospel was written to help people *keep going* — and it does.

In times of turmoil, we are called to witness with courage, to trust that Christ speaks within and through us, and to remain steadfast in love.
