## **FINANCE REPORT 2024**

Dear Parishioners,

It is with pleasure that we present the Parish Finance Report for the year ended 31st December 2024

In the past 12 months we have seen changes in the Parish activities, particularly with the implementation of the merger of both St John the Apostle and St Thomas Aquinas parishes.

This has been challenging for many of us and speculation about the parish finances will always happen.

With regards to the 2024 financial results for our parish, an operating deficit of \$24,758 was recorded, **however**, due to a timing and administrative issues, additional income of \$25,000 to cover our Insurance Excess Reserve was not recorded in the 2024 audited financial reports.

This amount will be recorded in the 2025 financial year.

### Accordingly, a surplus of \$242 would have been recorded for the 2024 financial year.

This is a very good result considering the challenges being experienced, and our thanks go to parishioners for their generosity and the parish staff for their hard work.

We will still experience some financial challenges from time to time, however, because of the success of the recent quarterly appeal and the generosity of parishioners over the year, we have been able to raise significant funds, and we are well placed to meet these challenges for this financial year.

Our bank funds reduced from \$110,157 in 2023 to \$82,962 in 2024.

However, since the end of the year, through your generosity and the banking of the \$25,000 previously mentioned we have been able to increase our bank funds to \$112,452 as of the end of March 2025.

Bearing in mind that the parish has an annual leave/long service leave liability of approx. \$91,000 with only \$58,685 currently held in the bank to partially cover this liability. The Finance Council has since undertaken action to place additional funds in this account to eventually fully fund this leave.

We again thank Parishioners for their continued support.

Our loan repayment of \$36,000 per year will continue for the next 9 years, and if we maintain to existing financial support from parishioners, we will be able to meet all future expenses and liabilities of the parish.

Please be assured that St John's parish is in a sound financial position and with the merger of both St John's and St Thomas's, we expect to be able provide cost savings due to the duplication of some expenses. I.E. One Website, one copyrights expense and other items.

However, there is always room for improvement and if you are not yet a contributor to the Parish Sacrificial/Planned Giving programme, we seek your assistance and financial commitment to help maintain the parish.

# **Future Needs**

Future priority capital works that need to be funded in the next 5-10 years. i.e.
